General Information

We have an elected Board which meets monthly who are responsible for the day to day running of the Club covering Membership Services, Finance & Administration, Marketing, Greens and Clubhouse Catering & Housekeeping.

The Sections are administered by their own Committees and are responsible for handicaps, competitions and matches.

Details of the Board/Committees are displayed in the locker rooms and in the Club diary.

Members' Details

Details of Club members i.e. names, addresses, telephone numbers etc., are held in a secure golf club management system (ClubV1) on a pc in the Secretary's office in accordance with the current General Data Protection Regulation.

Official handicap details are held in the ClubV1 golf system and are published on the HowDidIDo service. *More information on handicapping can be found in Annex 2.*

Members' Times

We operate a tee booking system and tees should be booked through the Clu bV1 system, or alternatively, with the Club Professional before play – 01743 860881. You may turn up and play but must liaise with the Club Professional for a start time. Tee times for competitions are booked via the ClubV1 system.

How to install the ClubV1 and HowDidIDo apps

Our ClubV1 system manages everything to do with the golf club, membership, accounts, bar cards, the till, competitions, tee bookings and member communication. All in one package.

Member's information, handicaps and competitions are all at your fingertips in a secure app you can freely download.

Your personal setup for Member's Hub and How Did I Do

This is an all new smartphone app for android and iPhone which contains everything you need to interact with the club in one game app. The app includes, Tee Time Booking (social and competition), diary, competition results, members directory, and live leader board on competition days. The club will also keep members up to date with club news and push notifications on course status, so the app is a must.

1.Load the ClubV1 Members Hub via the App or via a web browser. 2.Choose the Option for "Passport Registration".

2a. Enter your Email Address, Password and Full name in the Register Account page. 3.An activation email will then be sent to your email inbox. You will then need to click on the Blue "Confirm Account" button to activate your registration.

4. Once you have clicked on the "Confirm Account" button you will be redirected to the HowDidiDo Passport Website

5. You will then need to go to the ClubV1 Members Hub, as outlined in point 1., and this time chose PASSPORT LOG IN. Enter the details you registered with. Your club may show in the Linked Club above, if it does then please select that and you will now be linked to your club and will now be on the ClubV1 Members Hub dashboard. If, like in the image above, your club does not show up in the Linked Clubs section select the option to "Search for Clubs"

6. Once you choose the option for 'Search for Clubs' any club that has your email address on record will show up. If you see your club show up you will then need to select the box saying "--- Please select from dropdown ---". When you select that three home addresses will appear, you will need to select the Home Address that applies to you and hit Confirm.

7. After that you will now be logged in and on the Dashboard.

As often applies when making systems changes, even with planning and preparation in place, we may face some challenges of implementation. I would like to thank you for your anticipated understanding whilst our staff go through training and get used to the new system.

Clubhouse Opening Times

The clubhouse is open from 0730am until dusk each day during the Summer months (April to September), with catering available from 09:00. During the Winter period we are open from 0730am until dusk although we may be open later when functions are booked.

Dress Code

Please note the dress code has been relaxed in order that members and their guests may enjoy a more informal atmosphere, however we respectfully remind you that all clothing worn on the golf course and in the clubhouse should, at all times, be clean and presentable.

Not permitted on the course

- jeans and denims
- trousers must not be tucked into socks
- slogan or football type shirts
- tracksuits

Permitted on the course

- any accredited golf wear
- tailored shorts may be worn at any time, sports socks must be worn at all times

Not permitted in the clubhouse

- hats and caps
- golf shoes
- tee/slogan or football type shirts
- wet or muddy clothing

Permitted in the clubhouse

- any accredited golf wear (excluding above)
- clean (not ripped or faded) jeans
- clean training shoes
- tailored shorts
- the wearing of deck shoes/sandals without socks

On formal occasions and match meals gentlemen should wear jacket with collar and tie. Members and visitors are asked to conform strictly to the above codes of dress.

Appendix 2

Handicap Guide for New Members

New to golf?

If you would like to play competitive golf either at Arscott or any other golf club, you will need to obtain a **Handicap Index**.

What is a Handicap Index?

A Handicap Index allows you to play golf on an equal footing with everyone else who has a handicap, regardless of your ability or the course you play on.

How to obtain a Handicap Index

To obtain a Handicap Index you need to play and record scores from a total of **54 holes**. This can be from any combination of 9 or 18-hole rounds (for example, 3 x 18 holes, 6 x 9 holes etc).

If it is a social game, you have to register in advance that the round will be for handicap purposes – so no waiting until you see what you have scored before you decide whether you want that score included or not.

Each scorecard must say it is '**for handicap**' and show your **name**, the **date** and the **gross score** for each hole. Your card should be marked by a **responsible person** and both yourself and your marker should **sign** the card.

The card should then be given to the Handicap Committee via the Club Professional

Do this and you can obtain an initial Handicap Index. This will then get adjusted as you play more and start to fill out your 20 rounds (see below).

Your Handicap Index will be calculated by computer using the **WHS** (World Handicap System), operated by **England Golf**. You will be given a unique **CDH** (Central Database of Handicaps) **number** which will stay with you for life.

Once you have a Handicap Index you can submit more scores for handicap, either by playing in a competition or by playing a casual round.

How to develop your Handicap Index

Your Handicap Index will continue to develop until you have 20 scores recorded. The more cards you submit, the quicker you will get a fully developed handicap index that is a more accurate reflection of your ability. For fewer than 20 scores your Handicap Index will be calculated as follows:

3 scores: lowest score -2

4 scores: lowest score -1

5 scores: lowest score

6 scores: average of lowest 2 scores -1

7 or 8 scores: average of lowest 2 scores

- 9-11 scores: average of lowest 3 scores
- 12-14 scores: average of lowest 4 scores
- 15-16 scores: average of lowest 5 scores
- 17-18 scores: average of lowest 6 scores
- 19 scores: average of lowest 7 scores
- 20 scores: average of lowest 8 scores

From then on, your newest score will replace the oldest score on your record and your Handicap Index will be re-calculated based on the lowest 8 scores on your current record.

Course Handicap

Before playing a round of golf, you will need to convert your Handicap Index to a **Course Handicap**. This will change from course to course, depending on the difficulty of the course. When you play on a more difficult golf course, your Course Handicap may be 2 or 3 shots higher, or lower when you play an easier course. Handicap Index conversion tables are available outside the Pro shop, online and at all courses to enable you to calculate your Course Handicap. At Arscott, when you sign in to play a competition or preregister to play a casual round for handicap purposes, your course Handicap will appear on the sign-in screen, alongside your handicap index.

Playing Handicap

When playing in a competition, your Course Handicap may be further adjusted depending on the type of competition you are playing in. For example, in a singles stableford or stroke play competition your Playing Handicap will be 95% of your Course Handicap. Your Playing Handicap will be given to you by the competition organiser or will show on the sign-in screen or HDID when you sign in to play a competition.
